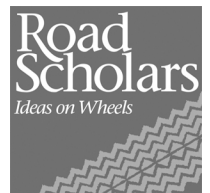

Bob Devin Jones is a writer, director and performer who lives in St. Petersburg. He has trained at the American Conservatory Theatre of San Francisco and the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art of London and holds a Masters degree from Loyola Marymount University, Los Angeles.

Bob's first play "Uncle Bends home-cooked negro narrative" was developed at the New Works Festival in Los Angeles and has been performed in Ireland and several states in the United States. His directing assignments include "The Black Nativity" for the Mahaffey Theatre in St. Petersburg, the California premieres of "Dinah Was," "On the Hills of Black America" in California. He also directed "Miss Julie" for American Stage, St. Petersburg and "War Music" - American Hellenic Theatre, Athens, Greece. His solo work entitled "Black Witness: James Baldwin," has been staged in theatres across the U.S.
