


## Getting free Project Gutenberg e-books to the Kindle

Project Gutenberg is the Internet's oldest website for free e-books. They have a sister project, called [LibriVox](#) for free audio-books.

Start with Gutenberg's e-book collection at <http://www.gutenberg.org/e-books/>

This page will allow you to select a way of searching for e-books.

There are several different ways to find books. The first is to search for a book. You can search for a title, author, or subject. Type the keyword into the search box, then click **Search**. This will bring up a list of results. Clicking on **Authors** will bring up a list of authors with the keyword in their name. Clicking on **Titles** will bring up a list of titles with the keyword in their name. Clicking on **Subjects** will bring up a list of subjects with the keyword in their name. These lists will be in order by the number of times they've been downloaded. After you search for a keyword, there will be a list of results with the keyword in the title, author, or description. They will be listed in order of the number of times the titles have been downloaded.

You may also browse for books by their popularity. Go to the e-book catalog page at <http://www.gutenberg.org/e-books/>. Clicking on **Authors**, **Titles**, or **Subjects** will bring up the list of the most popular authors, titles, or subjects. They are sorted by the number of times they have been downloaded. Clicking on **Bookshelves**, then clicking **Science Fiction** will give you a list of most popular science fiction downloads. Bookshelves are groups of books sorted by genre and lists that contain more than one genre. Clicking on **Popular** will bring up a list of the most downloaded e-books in the catalog.

Once you find an e-book you wish to download, click on the title. This screen will appear:

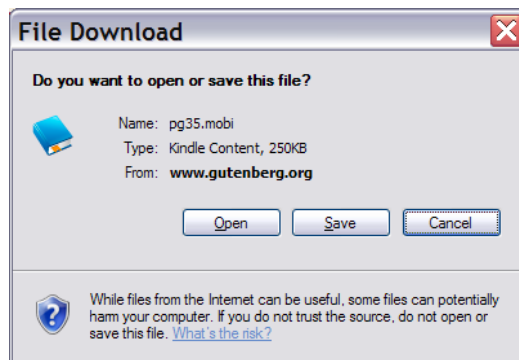

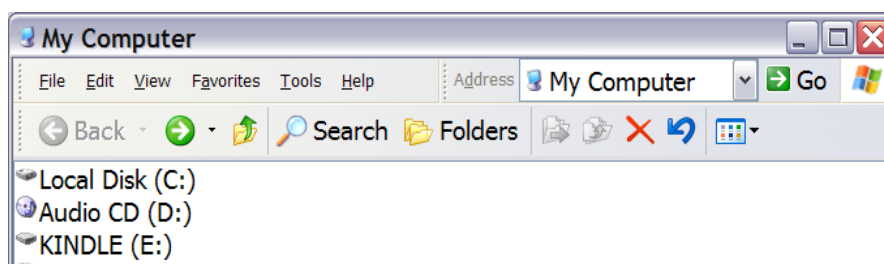

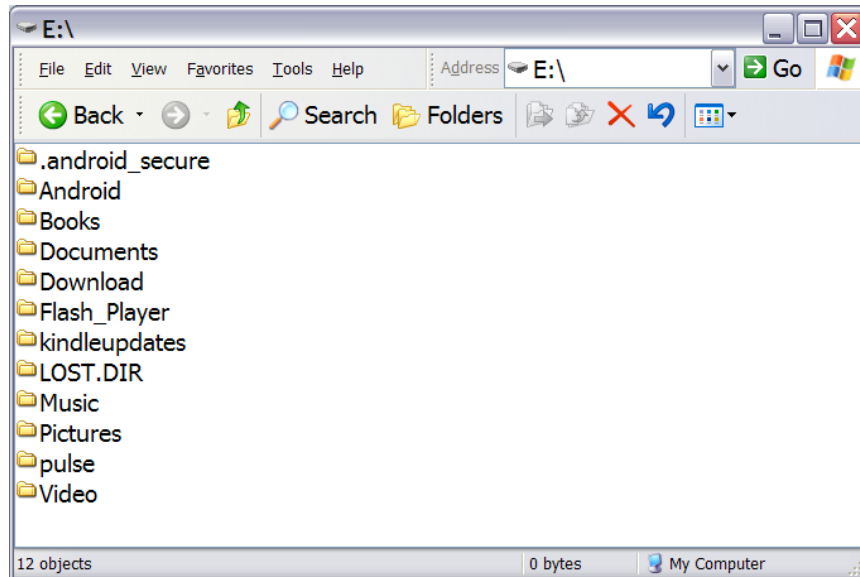
Click on **Kindle (no images)** to download a Kindle version of the e-book. When you get this screen, click **Save**:



Save the e-book to your Desktop or a folder on your computer. Now attach your Kindle to your computer using your USB cable. Open **My Computer** to open your Kindle. You should see the Kindle device listed, as below. On your computer, it might not be listed as the **E** drive.

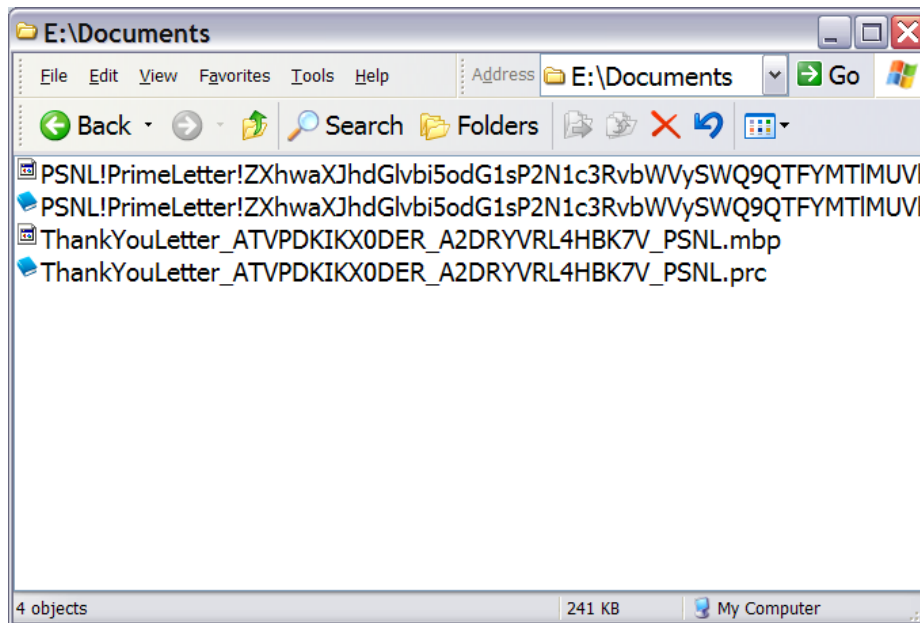


Double click on **Kindle** and you should see this screen:



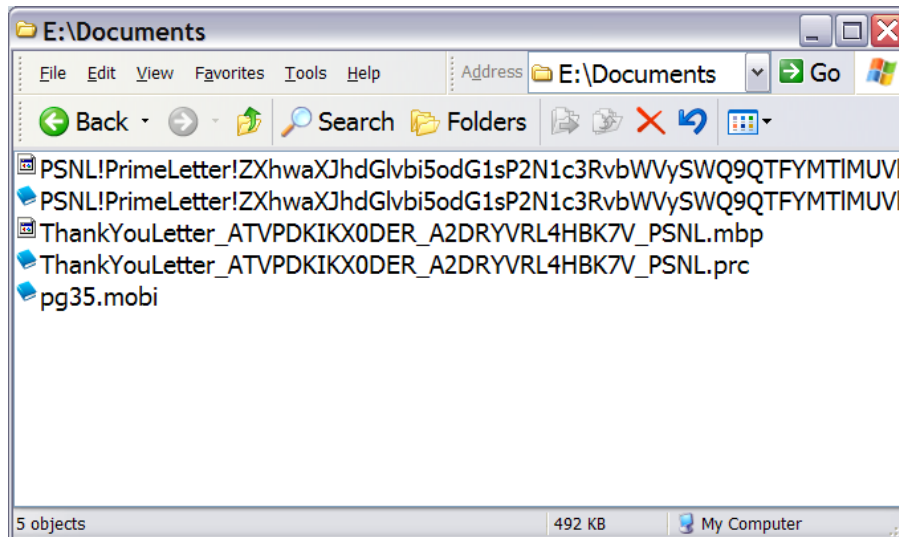
You need to move the Gutenberg e-book from your Desktop or wherever it was saved to the **Documents** folder of your Kindle. There are a couple ways to do this; if you're comfortable with Windows, you can simply drag and drop the Gutenberg file into the Documents folder on your Kindle.

Another way to do move it is to copy and paste the e-book. Find where you saved the e-book. Right click on the e-book file name. Click **Copy**. Open the **Documents** folder on the Kindle, like so:



Right click any of the white space in Documents. Click **Paste** to add the e-book to the Kindle.

Now you'll see the Gutenberg file (pg35.mobi), as below:



To disconnect your Kindle, right click on it in your **My Computer** folder. Click on **Eject** from that menu. Remove the USB cord once the computer instructs you to do so. Turn on the Kindle. From the Home screen, click **Docs**. You will now see your e-book! Click to open as you normally would and turn the pages.
