- Partnered with St. Petersburg/Clearwater Convention & Visitors Bureau Sports Commission to promote our quality programs to athletes from across the country, generating more than \$16.2 million in economic impact.
- 17 staff-led summer camp programs at seven city recreation sites served 991 children. Coordinated 26 contract instructor led specialty camps throughout the city.
- Taught over 16,000 swim lessons in city pools.
- Partnered with 18 youth and adult cosponsored groups, ranging from shuffleboard and softball for seniors to soccer and baseball for children. In 2003, 2,724 participants used city facilities.
- Approximately 650 volunteers gave 5,000 hours to support city special events and recreation programs.
- Established a new Cultural Affairs Division to implement the Clearwater Cultural Plan, promote the arts for economic and redevelopment initiatives, and stimulate the growth of arts and cultural resources.
- Received a U.S. Department of Interior National Trails designation for the East-West Trail.
