- Launched wireless Internet access at the Main Library, which is open to all visitors free of charge.
- Presented the popular series, *Women of Mystery: Three Writers Who Forever Changed Detective Fiction*, at the Clearwater East Library, one of the first venues outside California to offer this program.
- Received an autographed copy of *Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince* by British author J.K. Rowling, which will be on permanent display in the Youth Services area at the Main Library.
- Dedicated the Countryside Branch Library reference desk in honor of the late Lois K. Klein, branch manager from 1993 until 2005. The East and Countryside Branch Libraries received new carpeting and tile and other enhancements.
- Featured notable guests for lecture series including retired Sen. Bob Graham, Pulitzer Prize-winning police reporter-turned-mystery and true crime author Edna Buchanan, and the infamous Mr. Winkle.
- Promoted services to Hispanic residents through community-based partnerships, outreach to schools and book discussion groups.
