- Celebrated the opening of the Ross Norton Recreation and Aquatic Complex & Extreme Sports Park. The new 21,000-square-foot complex includes a teen lounge, fitness room, and a 10,000-square-foot gymnasium. Outside, the park boasts the city's first Extreme Sports Park. In-line skaters, skateboarders and BMXers can hone their skills in the 30,000-square-foot playground.
- Celebrated the opening of the McMullen Booth Pedestrian Bridge, an integral part of the Clearwater East-West Trail offering safe passage over one of Pinellas County's most traveled roadways.
- Coordinated volunteers who contributed more than 20,000 hours equating to \$356,400 in value to support parks and recreation activities.
- Partnered with Home Shopping Network, Ticketmaster, Super Target and Progress Energy to implement special environmental projects.
- Drew more than 260,000 attendees to events at Coachman Park.
- Implemented a new state-of-the-art membership management system at our pools and recreation centers, offering better customer service.
- Passed a Public Art Ordinance to enhance the look of the city with works of art and design that create a sense of place and increase the quality of life for residents and visitors.
- Cumulatively, more than 9,100 citizens attended or participated in cultural activities sponsored by the Cultural Affairs Division.

Cherry Harris, a lifelong member of the NAACP, fought to make Clearwater a better place for everyone, and the city named a park in her honor.
