- Development and Neighborhood Services partnered with the North Greenwood Community Health Resource Center to host a Back-to-School Wellness Day, where 2,300 children participated.
- Clearwater Police Department partnered with Directions for Mental Health (DMH), expanded the Child Development-Community Policing Program with the addition of a full-time therapist at Clearwater Police Department. This program provides psychological intervention services to children exposed to violence.
- Marine and Aviation partnered with various organizations to host the Clearwater Beach Kid's Day, YMCA Kid's Fishing Rodeo, Make a Difference Fishing Tournament for children and adults, and the Calvary Baptist Church Father and Kids Fishing Day.
- Parks and Recreation strengthened the partnership between the City of Clearwater and Ruth Eckerd Hall, by having Ruth Eckerd assume the management of the Clearwater Chorus.
- The City of Clearwater partnered with the Clearwater Neighborhood Housing Services (CNHS) to open a Business Center, which will house the Isay M. Gulley Head Start Center, office space for CNHS and three small businesses. The city provided funds to acquire the building, which previously was a bar, and CNHS did the renovations.

In 1924, Shirley Curtis was appointed principal of the Pinellas Industrial Institute, which later became Pinellas High School for African-American students.

In January 1912, many cities worked together to build Pinellas County's first courthouse in Clearwater for \$3,750. It was located at the present-day site of Peace Memorial Church on Fort Harrison Avenue.
