Young children, ages four through 11, learn about fire, electricity, emergency room awareness, traffic, pedestrian laws, burns, 911, and drowning prevention. ☀ **Kapok Wetland Restoration Project.** This project involved purchasing the 37-acre Friendly Village of Kapok mobile home park, relocating the residents, allowing for floodplain restoration, wetland creation, habitat improvement, water quality improvement, and the addition of recreation and education facilities.
