#### SHRED-A-THON & OPERATION MEDICINE CABINET

# SPRING BREAK PARK & RIDE SERVICE RETURNS

The city of Clearwater has once again teamed up with PSTA to make your trip to Clearwater Beach easier during spring break. Park & Ride offers beach visitors a place to park in a free designated lot, and then ride the trolley to the beach for free. Trolley Park & Ride service runs:

- Monday through Thursday, every 30 minutes from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.
- Friday to Sunday, every 15 minutes from 10 a.m. to midnight on Fridays and Saturdays and until 10 p.m. on Sundays.

Park for free at the former Clearwater City Hall location, 112 S. Osceola Ave., and board for free there, at the Clearwater Beach Transit Center or the Clearwater Beach Marina. Return service to the parking lot boards at the Clearwater Beach Marina. This service began Feb. 25 and runs through April 27. And don't forget about the Clearwater Ferry service, which offers a fun alternative getting to and from the beach. Visit PSTA.net/Spring.

### **UTILITY CUSTOMER SERVICE TO CLOSE EARLY ON MARCH 29**

On Friday, March 29, the Utility Customer Service Department will close early at 4 p.m. Normal operations will resume April 1. #### HOUSING REHABILITATION LOAN PROGRAM

The city of Clearwater's Housing and Rehabilitation Loan Program may help homeowners who qualify with coderelated repairs to bring their homes into compliance with the city's minimum housing code and the Department of Housing and Urban Development quality standards.

A Clearwater homeowner may receive up to \$60,000 in a 0% interest home rehabilitation loan for home improvements such as: roof replacement, electrical/plumbing repairs, air conditioner installation, door/window replacements, and American with Disabilities Act modifications of an immediate nature.

Depending on level of hardship, borrowers may qualify for a deferred loan. For program eligibility, visit MyClearwater. com/HomeRehab or call (727) 444-7167.
