WATERING RESTRICTIONS HAVE TIGHTENED

Due to current drought conditions, the Southwest Florida Water Management District issued a water shortage order last month that impacts the city of Clearwater. This order comes after significantly below-normal rainfall and declining water resource levels, and it applies to properties using drinking water, private well or surface water sources for watering lawns and landscaping.

Knowing your assigned watering day is one of the easiest and most effective ways to protect our water resources. Residents can water once per week when watering with all sources, except reclaimed water, which can be used any day of the week:

- Wednesdays Even-numbered addresses (or A-M)
- Thursdays Odd-numbered addresses (or N-Z), or mixed or no street address

Watering is not allowed between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any day from any source. The allowed watering day in the city of Clearwater may differ from other water supply municipalities or areas within unincorporated Pinellas County.

CITY CLOSURES & UPCOMING HOLIDAYS

City of Clearwater offices, libraries and some recreation facilities will be closed Feb. 16 for Presidents Day. Solid waste and recycling crews will be working that day, so there will be no change to the collection schedule.

SEE WHERE YOUR PROPERTY TAX DOLLARS GO

Clearwater has launched a municipal Property Tax Information Dashboard designed to help residents understand how the city's share of their property taxes is determined, allocated, and used to support essential services. The dashboard provides residents with easy-to-read visuals and detailed breakdowns of the property tax process — from how property values are assessed, to how tax revenues are distributed across city departments.

As one of several taxing authorities, the city receives only a portion of the total property tax bill. The Property Tax Calculator, which allows property owners to enter information from their own property tax bill, shows residents how their contributions support city services such as public safety, parks and recreation, street maintenance, libraries, and other services.

"Our city is guided by the strategic values of transparency, trust and integrity," said City Manager Jennifer Poirrier. "This dashboard gives residents direct insight into how their tax dollars are used and demonstrates our ongoing commitment to providing clear, accessible information about city operations and finances." THREE LANES OF TRAFFIC ALONG A PORTION OF COURT STREET TO CLOSE JAN. 20

Beginning Jan. 20, crews will be repairing aging sanitary sewer manholes beneath Court Street. For about two weeks, three of the four westbound lanes between South Prospect and Garden avenues will be closed.

Crews will be working around the clock to keep the project moving quickly. With only one westbound lane open, drivers may experience delays, so this is a great time to consider alternate routes, such as Drew Street, Fort Harrison Avenue, West Bay Drive or Gulf Boulevard.

Detour signs and message boards will help guide drivers through the area. Please use extra caution, especially near the Pinellas Trail. The work should be finished in about two weeks, weather permitting.

CLEARWATER FIRE & RESCUE OFFERS FREE CPR CLASSES

Residents are invited to register for free CPR classes. Sessions are from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the third Saturday of every other month at the Clearwater Fire & Rescue training facility at 1716 N. Belcher Road, next to Station 48. Dates include Jan. 17, March 21, May 16, July 18 and Sept. 19.

The focus is on being able to make a difference for a patient in the first few minutes before fire medics arrive on scene. Basic hands-on CPR related to chest compressions and AED usage are taught by Clearwater firefighters. Classes are free for city residents, and registration is required in advance.
