



What you need to know before heading to Clearwater Beach

BEACH RULES & REGULATIONS

- **MUST follow CDC social distancing guidelines:**
 - Stay 6 feet apart from others.
 - No group gatherings.
 - Face masks are recommended for all those in face-to-face interactions and where you can't abide by social distancing guidelines.
- People can exercise, walk or sit down along the beach as long as they stay 6 feet apart from others.
- There will be no beach chair, umbrella or cabana rentals at this time.
- Pier 60 will remain closed until further notice.
- Sand volleyball courts will remain closed.
- Playgrounds, including the one located at Pier 60 Park will remain closed.
- Big Event Slides' inflatables and bungee area will remain closed.
- Coolers, blankets, towels and personal chairs are permitted.
- NO alcohol or dogs allowed on the beach.

What is the city of Clearwater doing to keep me safe?

- Adding more hand-washing stations for visitors to use.
- Cleaning and sanitizing high-traffic areas frequently.
- Encouraging people to use mobile phone apps for parking and other services.

CLEARWATER BEACH AMBASSADORS

- Beach ambassadors will be stationed around the beach and along Beach Walk to remind people to practice social distancing and answer any questions. The ambassadors will also have hand sanitizer available for visitors to use.

PARKING

- All public parking lots will be open. The city of Clearwater is encouraging people to use the ParkMobile App to pay for parking, to decrease touching surfaces of parking kiosks. You can download the app in Apple's App Store or on Google Play.

How to use the Park Mobile App

- 1) Enter the zone number posted on signs around the parking meter in the ParkMobile parking app.
- 2) Select the amount of time you want to park and start your session.
- 3) You will get alerts when time is about to expire so you can extend your parking session.

BUSINESSES ON CLEARWATER BEACH

Phase 1 of Florida's reopening plan will be in effect beginning on May 4. What that means:

- Restaurants may offer outdoor seating with 6 feet of space between tables.
- Indoor seating will be capped at 25%.
- Retail can operate at 25% indoor capacity.
- Bars will remain closed.

Lifeguards:

- The Clearwater Beach Patrol will be fully staffed between 9:30 a.m.-7 p.m. daily.
- Lifeguards will be provided with PPE equipment to keep them safe when interacting with beachgoers or those who may be in distress.
